


MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Lethbridge. Marketing, administration,

Lethbridge Bulls. In addition to PBA
and the Bulls, the company also
contracts services for Spitz Stadium,
Lloyd Nolan Yard, Little League

1, Lethbridge & District International Baseball (travel team) Program, Western Canadian Amateur Baseball Foundation, Western Major Baseball League, and a few others as well.

The Prairie Baseball Academy Society remains a strong, functioning society that operates Lloyd Nolan Yard and looks after the grass cutting at Dave Elton Park. It also owns the assets at Lloyd Nolan Yard.

Prairie Baseball Academy (PBA) wishes to introduce the Honorable Shirley McClellan into the Builder/Community Leader category of our Hall of Fame.

She currently resides in New Brigden, Alberta where she farms with her husband, Lloyd, and their family.

Shirley was born in Hanna, Alberta, where she learned early on about the importance of education. Shirley knew that you needed to find ways to stand at the front of the line if you wanted to accomplish your goals. Be it with sports, politics or in life, Shirley always found a way to stand at the front of the line. Shirley's work ethic and passion for her community to this day, make her an incredible addition to our PBA Hall of Fame.

Shirley was first elected to the Alberta legislature in 1989, and served her constituents until she resigned in January 2007. Shirley served six terms as the member of the Legislature for Drumheller/Stettler. Oddly enough, Ralph Klein resigned the same day as Shirley. Makes you wonder who really was in charge of the Alberta Government during the Ralph Klein era!

Shirley held numerous senior cabinet posts over the years, including: Minister of Health, Minister responsible for the Wild Rose Foundation; Minister

responsible for the Alberta Alcohol and Drug Abuse Commission; Minister Responsible for Seniors; Minister of International and Intergovernmental Relations; Minister of Agriculture; Minister of Finance; Chair of the Treasury Board; and probably her most passionate appointment, Minister of Community Development. Shirley was appointed to this post in 1996. However, as her role changed within government, Shirley always made sure to stay involved in Community Development. It was here where Shirley's passions were exhibited to the citizens of Alberta. She was always willing to lend an ear for projects, that would better Alberta communities. She was very influential and successfully directed government monies for well thought-out parks and community centers. She was always there for her community.

Shirley had a vision and recognized the value that hockey rinks, community centers, parks and baseball fields brought to communities. She visualized an environment where people could come together to be involved in an activity.

Such was the case with the Lloyd Nolan Yard baseball facility. Shirley McClellan was instrumental in the construction of the Lloyd Nolan Yard facility. She could see the value that the Lloyd Nolan complex brought to the baseball community in Alberta and Canada. Shirley loved to watch baseball — she frequented games in Las Vegas, Ottawa, and, of course, at Lloyd Nolan Yard. Shirley took a keen interest in developing studentathletes in a first of its kind college baseball program in Southern Alberta.

It took visionaries like our 2021 PBA

HOF inductees to see a project of this magnitude through. Today, there are close to a dozen high school and college baseball academies competing each year in Alberta. The growth of baseball would not have been possible without individuals such as Shirley McClellan. For that, the PBA family owes her our sincerest gratitude.

Clint Dunford

Prairie Baseball Academy (PBA) wishes to introduce Clint Dunford into the Builder/Community Leader category of our Hall of Fame.

Clint's impact on Lethbridge extends beyond baseball, but PBA is incredibly thankful for his support over the years.


In the early days of PBA, Clint was the Minister of Advanced Education. At the time, neither the University of Lethbridge or Lethbridge College were that interested in having an affiliated team. When the organization started having conversations about being an independent academy, Clint suggested that they allow students to attend both programs to increase the player pool and increase student opportunity. He initiated the dual school program,

which remains in place at PBA to this day. Close to one-thousand student athletes have benefited from being allowed this educational flexibility in Lethbridge.

While Minister of Advanced Education, Clint (and Shirley) introduced PBA to the Heritage Fund. The Heritage fund matched PBA dollar for dollar. The funds were used for scholarships to support PBA players, which were desperately needed at the time. Clint and Shirley were key to the PBA scholarship program that has grown to give out anywhere from \$60,000-\$80,000 annually, to PBA players.

Once the scholarships were in place, Clint told Coach Kubicek that his office door was open, and Kub could get ahold of him any time he needed it. Coach Kubicek took him up on that! The vision was always that the PBA needed its own facility. Meetings with the University were unsuccessful. At the College, little headway was made. They had started setting up plans to build at the College, but those plans fell by the wayside. At the time, Clint was involved in Economic Development for the provincial government, and stepped in to approach the city of Lethbridge. Clint suggested that they donate land to the Academy. When asked to talk about Clint's influence on PBA, Coach Kubicek vividly remembered Rick and Clint standing at the current site of Lloyd Nolan Yard looking down into what was a shallow coulee. Back in those days, it was barren and filled with garbage including a memorable old fridge. Clint and Rick went to city council and were determined that this was the spot. Clint was the behind-the-scenes guy for the land donation. When they broke ground at what is now Lloyd Nolan Yard, Clint turned over the first shovel of dirt.

Clint Dunford was integral to the development of the facility at Lloyd Nolan Yard, and the Prairie Baseball Academy as an educational program. To all those that know Clint, to call him integral is still an understatement. The Prairie Baseball Academy would like to officially congratulate Clint Dunford on his induction into our PBA Hall of Fame for the class of 2021 in the "Builder/Community Leader" category.



Rick Williams


Prairie Baseball Academy (PBA) wishes to introduce Rick Williams into the Builder/Community Leader category of our Hall of Fame.

Rick Williams' influence on the Prairie Baseball Academy started in the first half of 1998. Rick was the Manager of Parks and Recreation with the City of Lethbridge. Lethbridge City Council had been bombarded with inquiries to build another baseball facility, a facility that the newly inducted PBA could call home. The inquiries came predominantly from a special group of men, recognized as our 2020 HOF inductees. Keith Jorgensen, Doug Jones, Rick Paskal and Coach Kubicek were persistent to the core. Eventually City Council decided to move ahead and the project was assigned to Rick Williams. This was Rick's introduction to the Prairie Baseball Academy.

Rick Williams met with this group of individuals. After hearing about the plan, he could have easily put the project and the dream on hold. After all, it was going to be a massive project! Rick did quite the opposite. He jumped into the project headfirst and asserted himself in ways not traditional of a near-retirement civic employee. The wheels were put in motion and tenders for the project were opened to the public. The estimates that came in were three times higher than the "dream team" had budgeted. PBA thought the dream may be dead before it even got started. Rick wasn't going to let that happen. He stepped up and took on the position of general contractor for the construction of the baseball field and indoor facility at Lloyd Nolan Yard himself. Ricks new job description (unbeknownst to the city) included: Recreation and Parks Manager, Lloyd Nolan General Contractor and PBA/City of Lethbridge official liaison.

Rick's tireless effort over the following months is one of the many reasons Lloyd Nolan Yard is home to PBA today. Rick took pride in the project and used the budget as efficiently as possible. Rick's vast experience allowed for some minor rule-bending during construction, which saved PBA thousands of dollars in the long run. Rick carried the burden of accountability on this project all the way up the ladder to the mayor's office. Rick's persistence and dedication to the project helped the PBA family literally build their dream baseball facility. At the time, and to this day, Lloyd Nolan yard remains one of the premier college baseball facilities in Canada.

Coach Kubicek

It is with great honor that our first inductee into the PBA Hall of Fame is none other than our first coach, Blair Kubicek.

Coach Kubicek moved to Lethbridge in the summer of 1995 and began working on recruiting the first ever PBA team. The Academy took to the field at Henderson Stadium on September 4th, 1995 with 52 players eager to show off their skills. The first year of the program had many hurdles to overcome and Coach Kubicek was determined to make Prairie Baseball Academy into a powerhouse college baseball program that could compete with similar programs across North America. Under Kubicek's reign as head coach from 1995-2010 he compiled a 353-279-3 record. During his fifteen years with the program 110 players went on to 4-year institutions, and 27 players were drafted or signed into professional baseball. Coach Kubicek's blue collar mentality has stayed with the Prairie Baseball Academy to this day and is one of the many reasons PBA has been so successful over the last 25 years. Coach Kubicek spoke on attitude and mentality all the time. We would like to leave you with a passage that Coach used at PBA for many years:

The longer I live, the more I realize the impact of attitude on life. Attitude, to me is more important than facts. It is more important than the past, than education, than money, than circumstances, than failures, than successes, than what other people think or say or do. It is more important than appearance, giftedness or

skill. It will make or break a team, a company, or a family. The remarkable thing is we have a choice every day regarding the attitude we will embrace for the day, in school and at the yard. We cannot change the inevitable. The only thing we can do is play on the one string we have, and that is our attitude. I am convinced that life is 10% what happens to you and 90% how you react to it. So, it is with you and your teammates, we are in charge of our attitudes. If we think we "can" or if we think we "cannot" we are right.

Committee member Omar Kadir had the privilege of contacting Coach Kubicek to inform him of his induction, and had this to say about their conversation:

"Coach Kubicek was very honoured to be receiving this Hall of Fame induction. He spoke highly of his time at PBA and really values the relationships he made with players and staff."



Keith Jorgensen

Our second inductee into the PBA Hall of Fame will be Keith Jorgensen. Unfortunately Keith passed away after a long battle with cancer in 2016. Keith will be honoured posthumously by his wife Beverley Jorgensen at this years banquet. The PBA staff would like to thank Bev for writing the following passage about Keith and his influence on the Prairie Baseball Academy from the very beginning:

Prairie Baseball Academy was truly a dream program for four visionary men. In the summer of 1993 Doug Jones

(President of Alberta Baseball), Blair Kubicek (Coach at Edmonds College), Reed Spencer (Scout for Colorado Rockies) and Dale Tilleman (Scout for the New York Yankees) had an inspiring conversation in regard to a Canadian College Baseball program. From this simple but profound idea they then approached Alberta Sport Council for support and the sport council responded quickly with a great deal of enthusiasm. Doug, Dale and Reed added a new recruit, Keith Jorgensen to their roster and they headed to Medicine Hat to meet with Wavne Schlosser, Lovell McDonnell and Kevin Friesen. In October 1994, Keith was elected the first President of PBA, Doug, the Vice-President, Dale, the Secretary-Treasurer and Board members were: Reed Spencer, Wayne Schlosser and Wayne Guenter. And Prairie Baseball Academy was established.

Keith served as President from 1994-2001. Many challenges were forthcoming in the early years as the program took shape. Keith was instrumental in drafting the PBA Constitution and PBA Mission Statement. As partnerships were formed with the University of Lethbridge and the Lethbridge Community College educational needs of the students were met. Between these two institutions, student athletes are able to receive excellent training in almost any field that they might choose to enter. Many meetings were held with the City of Lethbridge to develop a plan for a much needed facility. Construction was soon underway and Lloyd Nolan Yard became a reality with a grand opening in September 1999. PBA sponsored many winter and summer Instructional, Conditioning, Hitting and Pitching Seminars and Camps for youth in Southern Alberta. Coaches and Umpires Conventions were offered in conjunction with the annual PBA Awards Banquet.

Keith served on the Board of Directors from 1994-2016 as the Business/Promotions manager. He had a variety of responsibilities: player

registration, fund-raising, media guide program, awards banquet chairman, tournament organizer, and could almost always be found during home games at the barbecue or helping out in the concession.

As the program grew and young men came from all across Canada to hone their baseball skills with a desire to gain an education in their chosen career paths, Keith envisioned a Scholarship program that would encourage and help them to achieve both of these goals. And so the PBA Caddie Classic was formed. His goal was to bring together a community of likeminded golfers, to introduce them to PBA Baseball players and have a fun and rewarding day playing golf. To Keith's delight the first PBA Golf Tournament was a great success which resulted in a very successful Scholarship program too.

Prairie Baseball Academy was the perfect venue for Keith. He loved children, teaching, baseball, golf and being involved in his community. The Academy certainly provided Keith the opportunity to do all that he held dear to his heart and more.

As his family we feel a deep sense of pride that Keith will have a place of honor on the Wall of Fame for Prairie Baseball Academy. We know how much he loved baseball and especially this program, so we thank you for this tribute to his legacy. ~ Beverley Jorgensen and Family



Rick Paskal

Rick spent countless hours working with contractors and the City of Lethbridge to create a baseball facility that could be home to a Canadian college baseball program. Rick did all of this work while running his own successful trucking, cattle and feedlot business.



He always made sure to acknowledge both post-secondary institutions and the vital role they played in the success of the program. All three of his sons: Kurtis, Kevin, and Craig played for PBA and have since joined the family operation out in Picture Butte, AB.

Rick and the Paskal family have remained incredibly supportive of PBA through the years, donating thousands of dollars at fundraisers and banquets. The Paskal Family purchase the PBA Work Package in our live auction at the PBA Banquet almost every single year. The players come out to the farm for a day and pick hundreds of rocks out of the fields. Waiting for them at the end of the day is one of the best steak dinners you can imagine, all the fixings, for thirty or more hungry young players, it is a sight to see. Simply said, our program would not be the same without Rick's commitment. leadership, and strong values. We appreciate your dedication to our community and belief that pursuing a career in baseball is best paired with strong values and a quality education.

Two of our Hall of Fame Committee members along with Coach Hubka were able to get out to Picture Butte before the holidays to speak with Rick about what this honour means to him. As always, Rick was hesitant and humbled by the praise he was receiving. Rick

continued to say "He was a little unsure what he did to deserve such a big honour, he was just being a dad." Which sums up what an amazing person Rick is.

We at the Prairie Baseball Academy cannot thank Rick enough for being an amazing father, and literally helping build Lloyd Nolan Yard.



Larry Nolan

The Prairie Baseball Academy is proud to next induct Larry Nolan into our Hall of Fame. Prairie Baseball Academy owes an overwhelming debt of gratitude to Larry Nolan for his generous support from the very beginning of the PBA program.

Larry was first introduced and fell in love with the game of baseball as a youngster. He and his cousin, Keith Jorgensen (also inducted into the PBA HOF in 2020) played on the same Little League team in 1955. When the boys got a little older, Lloyd Nolan, Larry's older brother coached them and shared the same passion for baseball as the two young men. In 1996, Keith Jorgensen and Coach Kubicek met with Larry at his home. The group of men sat at the kitchen table and Larry was asked if he would become a Gold Sponsor of PBA. Larry said yes and was elated that he had an opportunity to give back to a baseball program in Southern Alberta. This was the beginning of an incredible relationship between Larry and PBA that has lasted through to this day.


Fast forward to 1997, Rick Paskal and Coach Kubicek approached Larry in

regard to a donation towards the construction of a new facility for PBA. Once again Larry answered with a resounding yes! The wheels were set in motion, The City of Lethbridge was on board, a location was determined and construction began under the expertise of Rick Williams. Coach Kubicek and Rick Paskal were the driving forces behind getting the facilities built: Blair had the vision, and Rick was the "man who walked with a big stick." Larry was so pleased to see the speed with which the facility took shape. Not long after breaking ground on the North Side of Lethbridge was the facility complete, the only detail left was to add a name to the facility. The Nolan family was consulted and it was determined that this baseball complex would be named "Lloyd Nolan Yard."

Recently, Larry was asked "Why would you choose to contribute in such a large way?" Larry replied "In my business I have had an opportunity to help others and I am grateful that I could." Larry expressed how special it is to have had baseball players approach him, shake his hand and say thank you. These special moments to Larry are what have made it all worthwhile. Baseball has always had a tender spot in Larry's heart and he is so pleased that PBA has brought the best to Southern Alberta. A closing thought from Larry and a quote:

"Baseball has grown so much over the last 25 years, and it is clear the role that the Prairie Baseball Academy has had contributing to that growth."





Dustin Molleken

Our 6th and final inductee into the PBA Hall of Fame for 2020 is Dustin Molleken. Dustin is the first and only player from PBA to play in the MLB. Originally from Regina, Saskatchewan, Dustin came to PBA in 2003 after playing with the Canadian Junior National Team. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

Ross Egan Memorial: Ross was an outstanding pitcher, playing for PBA and attending LCC. During the summer of 1997 Ross played for the Team Alberta summer games team. He was recruited and offered a scholarship to attend a U.S. college in the fall of 1997. He died in a traffic accident in the summer of 1997. Ross will always be remembered by Prairie Baseball Academy.

Tony Kubicek Memorial: In 1993 Tony was one of two high school baseball players in the state of Washington to be recognized in "Who's Who in High School Sports." Tony was a second team all star catcher for the Tritons while playing a Edmonds Community College. Tony played for the Dawgs during the fall of 1995. He was schedule to attend Mayville State University on a scholarship to complete his education but met with tragedy in a traffic accident June 13, 1998 near High River, Alberta. This scholarship is supported by the Kubicek family and the many friend of the family. The PBA is proud to present the Tony Kubicek scholarship.

Lloyd Nolan Memorial: Lloyd was born and raised in Picture Butte district and became a well known in the farming and cattle business. His success benefitted the family farm and his personality benefitted the community he was an important part of. Lloyd's life was shortened by health problems that he fought for some time. As the namesake of our ballpark, he will be remembered for as long as baseball is played at Lloyd Nolan Yard.

H.I. West Memorial: Hubert was a player and builder for most of his life. He coached played and coached for the Del Bonita Cubs of the Old Boundary Baseball League. They won the provincial men's

title in 1951 and won several league championships over the years as well. He was the president of Albert Baseball in 1951 and was the provincial commissioner of baseball beginning in 1954. As a coach, government and community leader, he is best remembered for creating opportunities for others in sporting and community affairs.

Justin Cardinal Memorial: Justin, son of Fred and Jeanette, played his youth baseball in Bonneyville, Spruce Grove, Edmonton and with the Calgary Dawgs. He played for the Albert Youth Selects, Team Alberta, and the Bellingham Bells in Washington state. His college career included Midland College in Texas, the Prairie Dawgs and Meza College in Arizona. Justin was a great competitor and an outstanding young man who was respected by teammates and opponents alike. He died tragically south of Champion, Alberta September 28, 2002. Justin is dearly missed by teammates and coaches.

Craswell & MacLean – TCMM Memorial:

Tanner and Mitch came to us from Charlottetown Prince Edward Island. Mitch came to PBA in the fall 2009 and Tanner attended the following year after transferring in from the College of Southern Idaho. Both players were an integral part of the 2011 CCBC Championship team. Their lives were tragically cut short on December 15, 2011. This scholarship is set up to help further baseball dreams for Maritime players.

Anthony Miller Memorial: Anthony began his baseball career in Nova Scotia in 1997 with the Rawdon Tigers T-Ball program. Miller played with multiple teams in his youth baseball career

including the Rawdon Tigers, Truro Bearcats, Hants North Jays and joined the Noel Road Jays from 2011-2014. Anthony was passionate about baseball and had a true love for the game. Anthony played the game with grit and respect for his teammates, opponents and officials. Miller would encourage and support his teammates and he always had their back. Anthony's coaches described him as being "a passionate, fiery kid", and a "one of kind kid teammate." He will always be remembered for his contagious smile and for showing up excited and ready to play each day. Anthony passed away February 9, 2016 at the age of 23 after a short but courageous battle with a rare form of cancer. Anthony is the brother of Varsity Assistant Coach Ryan MacDonald and we are honoured to be able to hand out a scholarship in his name each year.

Scott Reiter Memorial: Scott Reiter was an avid baseball enthusiast who was often seen supporting the Lethbridge baseball community. Highlights from his personal playing career included a trip to the 1980 Big League World Series in Fort Lauderdale, Florida and a state title with the 1981 Lethbridge American Legion Elks. After graduating from university and starting his own business in Lethbridge, Scott began his 20 plus years of supporting the PBA. In the early years, he helped with the annual PBA golf tournament. As a coach himself, Scott was always amazed at the improvement players made under the guidance of Coach Kubicek and Coach Hubka. When Scott was diagnosed with cancer in early 2018, he always talked about when he would get better, not if he ever would be. Scott passed away on January 16, 2019. May this scholarship continue to give Scott the platform to support the program he respected.

ACADEMICS

What every student athlete must know about Academics and Prairie Baseball Academy



The first thing is absolutely imperative each player must understand, is that you are coming to Prairie Baseball Academy to further your education. Education must come first, that is not to say that baseball is not important to you or us, The reality is that you must be successful in the classroom to be able to play college baseball. If your goal is to go on from the Prairie Baseball Academy to an N.C.A.A. or N.A.I.A University and play, then you must attain the highest grades possible while you are here. Mr. Secretan is with our program to assist anyone in their academic career. We also suggest that you write the ACT or SAT exams before coming to Prairie Baseball Academy. We hope that every student athlete that comes to Prairie Baseball Academy realizes their goal. We have done everything in our power to facilitate the goal but it must take a commitment from you to accomplish it.

Academic Advisor Glenn Secretan

Glenn brings an extensive background in education and athletics to the program. As a high school coach with over twenty years experience, he understands the needs of the student athlete. His teams have won five provincial championships in baseball and basketball and his time outside work has always been spent in amateur sports.

Having raised four sons with his wife, Penny and seen them all go on to college and university, he has insight



into the needs and experiences of college students. As a former high school counselor and a current college professor, he has the background and knowledge to help new students succeed in post secondary education.

The Role of the Academic Advisor

The academic advisor can assist students in many ways, beginning with helping in applying to school and assisting in finding accommodation in the city. He has a great knowledge of programs at both the college and university and can suggest programs of study as well as individual courses. For Alberta students, help with student loan problems can be given. The business of adding or dropping courses can be confusing, as can dealing with telephone registration systems. He can help with concerns in all student registrations and programs. Students sometimes find themselves in need of tutoring and the advisor knows of many qualified people who can assist with these difficult areas. Some tutoring is free and those that charge fees are usually very reasonable. One of the most important areas for the student is the relationship they develop with their professors. The advisor can act as a liaison between the student and the professor and can intervene when problems arise. The advisor administrates the PBA scholarship program and co-ordinates the awarding of all scholarships.



Attendance in class is vital to success and the program tries to ensure that students attend regularly. This may at times include daily monitoring of class. Every student report achievement through an in-house reporting system and discusses his progress with the advisor. The advisor also assists in communicating with registrar's offices and department heads.

The key success in school lies in the three areas: attendance, time management and personal motivation. Attendance is the first prerequisite to achievement and there can be no equivocation here – students cannot succeed if they are not there. This means that the student must find a balance between education and his social life very early - failure to do this will result in failure in the class room. Time constraints are significant for baseball players during certain times of the semester so players must budget time carefully. This is good training for a student and good training for life as well. Motivation is everything in athletics and the same motivation and commitment is necessary in the classroom. When you want to succeed it often happens. At PBA we are concerned with the development of the entire person as student, athlete and citizen. Student athletes in the program are required to maintain a 2.0 GPA in order to continue their participation on the team. Many of our students attain a 3.0 or higher GPA.

LLOYD NOLAN



Who Was Lloyd Nolan?

Lloyd Nolan for whom our Yard is

named was a very interesting young man. Diagnosed with Muscular Dystrophy at a very young age and given very little encouragement about having a long life, Lloyd set out to live his life to the fullest and perhaps even out live the odds. Lloyd played in a local band and because he was one of only a few young men with a car, he often took many friends with him to dances around the country side. Lloyd's friends danced and partied all during the evening but once the dance was over then the real party began. If only his car could talk, the stories would be an interesting adventure for each of us. I've heard tell that many a night the car found its' way home in the dark sometimes via a ditch or two. Lloyd's musical talents gave him the opportunity to increase his ever widening circle of friends from the city of Lethbridge all the way to Brooks and beyond.

Although Lloyd couldn't play baseball, he loved the game and coached the Iron Springs Little League team with Keith Jorgensen in 1961 and 1962. What a fun two summers they were, not only for him but for the young players he was involved with. One special young man from that team was Gerrit vande Steeg. whom I sure many of you know from your involvement in Lethbridge Little League and the American Legion program. Lloyd was a great organizer even at the tender age of 17. He took this Little League team throughout southern Alberta in league and tournament play. Lloyd also coached a girl's softball team for at least two years, and they travelled to many communities playing softball as well.

In the late 60's Lloyd started a calf feeding system where calves were raised on pail milkers. From this small two calf operation, Bernard, Lloyd and Larry built up a feedlot operation that now houses approximately 10,000 animals. Lloyd attended many auctions buying calves and soon became a cattle buyer for many local cattlemen. Lloyd loved to travel all over North America and made many interesting trips with family and friends. Rick Paskal, who helped build this yard, became one of Lloyd's travelling companions.

Lloyd had a reputation of being fair, dedicated, honest, trustworthy, innovative, independent, a supporter, an entrepreneur, a risk taker, a taskmaster and a friend. Even in the later stages of his life - when his muscles were not very pliable, he still wanted to be treated just like one of the guys. He never wanted any special attention nor to be treated with special concessions.

The Nolan home was always busy with many visitors and friends, and extended family were always welcome. They came from far and wide to visit, to seek advice, but mostly just to enjoy the hospitality of the Nolan family. A rumour was floating about in the community how Lloyd was so side-tracked by the many visitors that he didn't have time to take care of the computer stock market business he had set up in his own home and apparently lost some money. It wasn't but a rumor I'm sure, but Lloyd took it guite seriously and for the next six months was very diligent in attending to the business at hand and soon had acquired a small fortune - all of this happened long before the internet was established as we know it today.

Lloyd passed away in 1991 at the age of 47 leaving quite a legacy as well as proving how even as handicapped as he was, a fortune could be made. certainly proved to the medical community that if you give all you have to life, your rewards will be unlimited. Lloyd's sense of humour, his zest for life and his dedication to be the very best citizen he could, allowed him claim to fame and fortune. It was to allow many young people an opportunity to pursue their claim to fame by becoming a baseball player, that the Nolan family supported the construction of this great facility and are still proud to be part of PBA.
